

Car owned by missing man found

A car owned by one of two Las Vegas men missing for nearly a month was found in the parking lot of a North Las Vegas casino Wednesday, but investigators still don't know where they may be, Las Vegas police said.

The 1986, gold-colored Lincoln Mark VII, owned by Scott Rehn, was parked at Joe's Longhorn Casino, 3016 E. Lake Mead Blvd., when it was located by a casino security guard, who reported it to North Las Vegas police, Metropolitan Police Detective Larry Hanna said.

Metro police are continuing to

comb the vehicle for clues to the disappearance last month of Rehn and his friend and business associate, James Sorenson, but so far have turned up nothing, Hanna said.

"It appears as though the car was just left," he said.

The pair was last seen Feb. 19 by an employee of Rehn's, who had dinner with them in northwest Las Vegas. They gave no indication as to what they were doing after they ate, but Rehn mentioned they planned to work on a truck at Rehn's trucking company the next day, Hanna said.
