At my dad's funeral, which was standing room only, his dear friend for over 35 years spoke and he said " Scott loved life and lived everyday to it's fullest. He loved his family- Heather and Heidi and was the proudest grandfather when little Savannah was born. He loved his trucks and his business. Scott was a very talented man. Everything he did- he did very well. He has done everything from farmer to carpenter, welder, heavy equipment operator to truck driver. He was very meticulous and his work was done with great pride. Scott worked hard and Scott played hard. He was an excellent snow skier, water skier, snowmobiler and hunter." I don't understand why we're having to defend my dad?! He was a great guy!

I was angry at God for a lot years for allowing this awful thing to happen to my dad and our family, until I finally realized that God gave people the free will to choose right from wrong. Richard and Marnie chose to do wrong, VERY WRONG! Therefore they should pay. There is no way they should ever be released from prison. This was a senseless crime! This did not have to happen. They took my dad away from me. We would have done anything to save him and paid any amount of money to keep him with us, and they just threw his precious life away like away like it was nothing at all! Well, it was! They made the choice to kill my dad over and over and then hide it. I am the only one who happened upon the pictures of my dad after he had been barried in the desert for three months. Those dreadful memories will never go away of my dad's tipped up nose, smashed flat with the imprints of string from the duct tape on it. It is horrible! I can't even express the pain and heart ache this has caused to so many peoples lives. They don't even deserve to breathe air, they took my dad's life! How dare they? Who do they think they are? We will never get over the loss of my dad, we will always have a deep pain in our hearts. They robbed us of my dad at such a young age, 40 years old. We didn't get near enough time with him. My kids Savannah 10, little Scottie 8, and Sarah 4, as well as my sister's kids Mackenzie 6, Riley 1 ½, and Wolfie 5 months, never had a chance to get to know their grandpa. My dad would have loved them all. They robbed us of so much.

Sunday, January 18, 2004 would've been my dad's 50 th birthday. Richard got to live in freedom 17 years longer than my dad even got to live. Richard then had the nerve to write my grandfather a letter the day they killed my dad, and try to justify his actions. What a truely sick human being, how did this happen? They may have justified in their heads or on paper that what they did to my precious dad was justified, but they are WRONG!!!

This has taken away a piece of my heart and I will never be the same. This hurt is too deep to explain. This hurt has taken away from my family, you have no idea how many ways this horrible murder has affected all of our lives.

My family and I should not have to go through this every ten years and drag up all of the hurt they have inflicted on us, it's hard enough as it is, but we will we do whatever it takes to keep these monsters in prison.

The foundation of our country was built upon the Word of God and the Bible says in Genesis 9:5,6 – homicide demands a punishment that matches the crime. Therefore, Richard and Marnie should be shot, beat with the butt of a gun, have their entire heads duct taped, suffocated and left in the desert for three months.

Parole is not an option in my eyes.
